Reflection questions:

- 1. What parts of your story—your wounds and your gifts—are you still learning to see with compassion, and how might sharing them invite healing for yourself and others?
 - Consider how acknowledging both your pain and your potential could open the door to transformation, rather than just change.
- 2. Who do you struggle to see as "golden and wounded," and what might it look like to approach them with sacred agnosticism—without needing to fully understand or justify their story before extending compassion?
 - Reflect on how "getting proximate" to the stories of others might shift how you view differences and build deeper connections.
- 3. In a world that often prioritizes policy and power, what would it mean for you to live as if connection, story-sharing, and compassion were revolutionary acts of transformation?
 - Think about how the practice of listening—deeply, patiently, and lovingly—can shape not only your relationships but the kind of change you choose to support.

Including a reparations-based approach, Growing Home Collective reduces barriers for Black people to access GRuB programs, resources, and leadership opportunities. Led by an advisory group with Black staff & community members, this group co-creates affinity programming by, with and for Black people, to center Black self-determination, creativity and lived experience.
