Our roof's long-needed maintenance and repair continues this week with a fresh coat of paint and replacing the skylights. Watch your step—and your head!







Climate Challenge Series Kicks Off

This first session will focus on how to reduce your transportation footprint. The Federal Tax Credit for buying used and new Electric Vehicles will end Sept 30th. If you have considered at all buying one come here a panel of owners talk about what it is like owning one, range issues, all about charging, etc We will explain how the credit works and other ways to reduce the cost. Also panel members will have their EV's out in the parking lot for people to look over and sit in, etc. In addition will discuss ways for people with gas cars to reduce their carbon footprint as well: trip reduction, full tires, more walking and biking etc. We are building a community of resilience – please join us.
